CBI RETURNS TO SEATTLE

Join CBI at the Renaissance Seattle Hotel for the **National Student Electronic Media Convention** Oct. 25-27! [Session proposals](#) are now open.



Entries for the **National Student Production Awards** close **May 11, 2018**. There are two new award categories, Best Audio Sportscast and Best Video Sports Reporting.

The **CBI Film Festival** makes its debut at this year's Seattle National Student Electronic Media Convention. Open to student-produced work completed between Nov. 1, 2017-Oct. 1, 2018, four categories are available: **Short Film Fiction** (3-10 minutes), **Short Film Non-Fiction** (3-10 minutes), **Digital Shorts** (no longer than 3 minutes), and **TV Pilot** (no longer than 30 minutes).

The festival screening is **Friday, Oct. 26** from 4-6 p.m. during the convention. Winners will be announced and the winning entries will be shown.

Entries cannot be submitted for CBI's National Student Production Awards. Entry fee is \$10 for CBI members and \$25 for CBI non-members.

More information including submission guidelines is forthcoming. Deadline for submissions is **Oct. 1, 2018**.
